Scott D. Delacourt is Deputy Bureau Chief of the FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. In this position, Mr. Delacourt oversees two of the Bureau's operational divisions – the Broadband Division (responsible for the development and licensing of wireless broadband services) and the Spectrum Competition & Policy Division (responsible for transactions, infrastructure issues, and forward-thinking spectrum policy).

Prior to serving as Deputy Bureau Chief, Mr. Delacourt was Chief of Staff and Associate Chief of the Wireless Bureau, responsible for counseling and staffing the Bureau Chief, long-range planning, and Bureau management. His tenure as Chief of Staff followed prior service as Senior Counsel in the Office of General Counsel and as a Legal Advisor in the Wireless Bureau Front Office.

Prior to joining the Commission, Delacourt was an attorney with the law firm of Wiley, Rein & Fielding, where he specialized in communications law issues, including wireless, Internet, common carrier, and appellate matters. In addition, he is a Trustee of the Federal Communications Bar Association Foundation, where he serves as the Secretary.

Delacourt received his B.A., *summa cum laude*, from Georgetown University. He received his J.D., *cum laude*, from the University of Michigan Law School, where he was Articles Editor of the Michigan Telecommunications and Technology Law Review.
