UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL BAN KI-MOON**

A career diplomat, UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon has kept a whirlwind pace of geopolitical diplomacy since assuming office in January 2007. He brings 37 years of service in both government and on the global stage and has had ties with the United Nations that date back to 1975. Prior to his election, Mr. Ban served as Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade for the Republic of Korea since 2004, during which time he held posts in New Delhi, Washington, D.C. and Vienna. He holds a degree in international relations from Seoul National University and a master's degree in public administration from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. Mr. Ban has stated as his priorities at the United Nations: poverty, HIV/AIDS, environmental degradation, protecting human rights and combating terrorism.
